

CRRSA and ARP Acts

Accountability and Transparency Website Reporting Requirements – January-March 2021

The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSA Act) and the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP Act) provides emergency funds for students financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Department of Education encourages institutions to report as soon as possible, but no later than 30 days after the publication of this notice (05/13/21) or 30 days after the date the Department first obligated funds under HEERF I, II, or III to the institution for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students, whichever comes later.

Accordingly, the following information must appear in a format and location that is easily accessible to the public. This information must also be updated no later than 10 days after the end of each calendar quarter (September 30, December 31, March 31, and June 30) thereafter, unless the Secretary specifies an alternative method of reporting:

An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. This signed agreement carries through to the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) programs.
