

ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE REQUIREMENTS

Application files will be evaluated and acceptance will be by rank order using the following criteria for acceptance.

1. Required **58.7 (420)** on the pre-entrance exam: The ATI TEAS (version seven). Applicants will be ranked, according to the ATI TEAS score. The ADN program accepts the top 30 applicants and 10 at-large positions. The original 30 seats will be ranked by TEAS score, with preference given to in-district residents. SIC will evaluate wait-listed and out-of-district applicants for additional at-large positions, potentially adding 10 students each to the PN and ADN programs. If an at-large cohort is added, ranking will be done by TEAS score without preference to in-district students. Tuition rates for out-of-district students will be determined by the student's residency.
2. Completion of all required prerequisite courses with a grade of "C" or better. Grade point average will be calculated only for prerequisite courses required for the ADN program if there is a tie on the ATI TEAS score.
3. In the event that these calculations are tied an overall grade point average will be calculated and used for entrance to the Nursing Program.
4. All prerequisite course grades must be completed **prior to start of program** with a grade of "**C**" or **better**. Prerequisite Courses: BIOL 261** and BIOL 262** (Anatomy and Physiology I & II), Communications 121 or English 122, BIOL 242** (Microbiology), and NUR 219* (Health Professions Advanced Student Skills)

**BIOL 242, 261, and 262 Prerequisite: "C" or better in high school chemistry or CHEM 123 or equivalent. BIOL 261 must be taken prior to BIOL 262.

*NUR 219 Prerequisite: This 2 credit hour course should be taken in the summer prior to entering the ADN program. It is repeatable. The student must either currently be enrolled in the PN program or a graduate of the PN program. If the student has been out of the practical nursing program for five or more years, he/she must complete additional hours in NUR 219. See advisor for specific information.

Transfer students: An official transcript must be sent to SIC Enrollment Services by the end of summer 2026 semester. An SIC advisor will evaluate the general education courses needed for transfer and determine if the course content is comparable and the applicant's grade is satisfactory for transfer. All coursework/prerequisites must be completed with a "C" or better for acceptance into the program. It is the applicant's responsibility to verify that all transcripts have been received by SIC Enrollment Services and evaluated. All ADN nursing courses must be taken at Southeastern Illinois College.

5. To become eligible for the ADN program, the applicant must meet one of these criteria:
 - a. Be currently enrolled in an accredited Practical Nursing Program that will be completed by August 1, 2026; **OR**
 - b. Submit proof of successful completion of an accredited Practical Nursing program and a copy of a current unencumbered Illinois LPN license by the end of the Summer 2026 semester.
6. Applicants who are transitioning directly from the PN program to the ADN program must have an Illinois Practical Nursing license by the end of the Fall 2026 semester to remain in the 2026-2027 ADN program.

7. RETURNING STUDENTS: Students who exit the program for reasons other than health issues, must complete the application process, including admission and other required testing, and will be ranked as a returning student as program space permits. Returning students must reapply for the next academic year to receive credit for current nursing coursework. Students who are returning in Spring must have advisement, TEAS testing, and application completed by October 31 of the academic year of return. If a student reapplies after the next academic year, all nursing courses must be repeated. After the student has exhausted two attempts in the PN or ADN program, he/she must wait a minimum 5 years to reapply. Students entering the program for the third time will be required to retake all nursing program classes. Students may not reapply after the third attempt.

CPR (CE-10-072B) – American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS)/Healthcare Provider Certification (HCP) must be verified before clinical attendance. A current BLS/HCP Certification from AHA instructor will be accepted. Certification must be valid through the program end date.

Final acceptance to the program requires that all of the above criteria be met. Failure to meet any of the requirements will make the applicant ineligible for enrollment in the program. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that all requirements have been met.
